



Dance shoes and attire 2011–2012

Combo–dance clothing, pink ballet shoes and tan tap shoes

Ballet–tights, leotard, skirt or hot shorts and pink ballet shoes

Tap–dance clothing and tap shoes

Jazz –tan jazz shoes, tight dance clothing, make sure your knees are covered

Pom –dance clothing or shorts (short shorts need to have tights or biker shorts under them) and a tight shirt with jazz shoes

Hip Hop–jazz shoes or sneakers clothing that you can move in

- Hair should be pulled up off your neck for Ballet and pulled back out of your eyes for all other classes.
- No jewelry, with the exception of small earrings.
- Students are welcome and encouraged to bring water to class.

Dance shoes can be purchase at a local dance store; a few examples are Show Biz 840–4406, Dance Diva 324–6630 or Creative Dancewear 843–2545.

When you walk in explain you are from The Pulse Dance Studio and they can guide you in the right direction. If you still have shoes from last year or have already purchased shoes there is no need to buy new. When your child’s foot grows then purchase the correct pair.

All Recreational Only:

Combo – Ballet–Bunny Hop Bloch and Tap–Mary Jane Bloch tan #352G

Ballet – Bloch split sole 205 or 203/any ballet shoes is ok as long as it fits your child foot well

Tap – Mary Jane Bloch tan #325G, except the following:

Tap Int age 9–11 & Tap Beg/Int 10–up – Bloch Black slip on #389

Jazz – Bloch tan 495

Pom – Bloch tan 495

Hip Hop 1 – Bloch tan 495

All other Hip Hop – sneakers with laces/make sure your street shoes are clean

Boys Ballet–Black ballet shoes, Tap–Black tap shoes, Combo is both ballet and tap shoe, Jazz or Pom–Black jazz shoe Bloch, Hip Hop–Clean Sneakers
